How to apply:

There are no set rules about the form or style of the submission, although entrants may wish to bear in mind Johnson's own ideas about the essay, as exemplified by *The Rambler*, *The Idler* and *The Adventurer*.

The closing date for the competition is 31 October 2011: entries received after this date will not be considered. Please send two copies of your essay to Dr Freya Johnston, St Anne's College, Oxford OX2 6HS. (Entries by email will not be considered.)

Entries should be a maximum of 2,500 words, typed in 12 point, double-spaced and printed on single-sided paper. Pages should be numbered and securely attached. Footnotes and references are not required and should not be included. Please enclose the following details with your essay: your name, address, telephone number and email address, and a signed declaration that the essay is an original piece of your own work.

The winner will be announced on 10 December 2011 at the annual luncheon of The Johnson Society of London.
